Meet the Pilarski Family

Dear members of First Lutheran, greetings in Christ our Savior!

I'm Adam Pilarski and by the grace of God and his call, your new pastor. What an honor from our Lord to be called to this high and holy office.

I was born in Homer, Alaska, though only lived there for the first nine months of my life before my family moved back down to Portland, Oregon and that is primarily where I grew up. I attended Grace Lutheran School and we transferred to the church from an ELS church when I was six years old. For years I planned on being an architect and even attended two semesters at Portland State University to study architecture. However, I only made it to October of that first semester before deciding that architecture wasn't
